Participants are supported to deliver real impact in their school from day one. Over the two years they'll benefit from:

- Intensive leadership development training based on the latest research
- Ongoing mentoring and coaching from experienced headteachers and executive coaches
- Visits to exemplary schools to see great leadership in practice
- Focus on an impact project aligned to your school improvement strategy
- Membership of our national network of committed school leaders sharing ideas and best practice

The majority of the programme costs are covered by the National College for Teaching and Leadership. Schools pay a £1,500 contribution per year, giving you:

Year one:

- Inspirational summer residential training event
- 3 whole-cohort weekends
- 3 one-day learning events
- 6 one-to-one coaching sessions
- Mentoring from an experienced head working in a similar context
- Termly meetings with a peer learning group

Equivalent to 15 days of face-to-face training for under £120 per day.

Year two:

- Inspirational summer residential training event
- 2 whole-cohort weekends, including career guidance and support towards gaining headship
- 6 one-to-one coaching sessions and continued access to a mentor
- Study tour of schools in different contexts to help you learn from the best

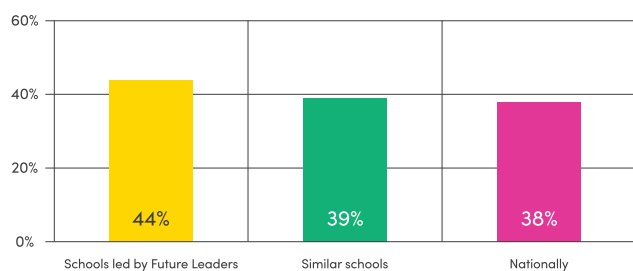
Equivalent to 10 days of face-to-face training for around £150 per day.

Impact

Disadvantaged pupils have higher attainment in schools led by Future Leaders, and improve faster in maths and English

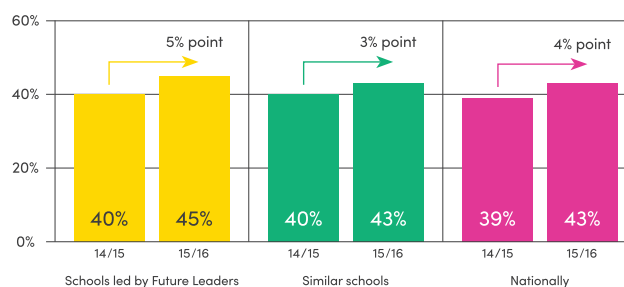
Disadvantaged pupils in primary schools led by Future Leaders for three or more years have higher attainment than those at similar schools or nationally.

Secondary schools with a Future Leaders headteacher see a greater improvement in the percentage of disadvantaged pupils achieving A*-C in English and maths than in similar schools or nationally.

77% of headteachers working with Future Leaders participants say they have impact in their school after less than a term on the programme.
