Clare Sealy is the Headteacher of St Matthias Primary School in Tower Hamlets in the East End of London. She is interested in the application of cognitive science in the primary and early years classroom; particularly, what it tells us about how we plan for long term learning through careful curriculum design. In November 2018, The TES published Clare's research review article How to Build a Primary Curriculum. In December, Clare was named by the TES as one of the top 10 most influential people in the world of education this year. She blogs about how her school is attempting to put educational research into practice.

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Course Summary:

- Current national perspectives on curriculum;
- How we might build a curriculum that promotes long term learning through applying research from cognitive science;
- An overview of how memory works and how this can influence our thinking about curriculum;
- Exploring how we can plan links that reinforce learning across year groups and across subjects, creating a coherent curriculum;
- How we can develop a curriculum that puts rich knowledge and vocabulary at the heart of learning.

The outcomes from this day should enable Primary Headteachers and Senior Leaders to understand the principles of curriculum design and to consider the implications for curricula within their own schools.
